## District Chairman 2023-2024 Kamala A Yeap

#### My Journey as the 43rd District Chairman

My journey as the 43rd District Chairman in the Centennial year of Inner Wheel was one that would be forever etched in my mind. It was an honor and a great privilege to be given the task to lead a District of over 19 clubs and about 375 members for this term.

The themes that had been identified for the term, "Shine a Light", "Mental Wellness Brightens Lives" and "Brighten Lives for the Future" were stressed and many clubs did take up the challenge in carrying out projects that signified these themes. Effort was put into ensuring that Inner Wheel took consideration into the lives of the less fortunate, people who needed an extra helping hand for a brighter future and being there when aid was needed. It was not an easy task but some means was found to render whatever was needed. It warmed my heart to see so many helpful clubs and members who stepped in whenever assistance, be it financial or otherwise was required. This insight that I have gathered will go with me for a long, long while,

Being the Centennial year brought in much delight and to highlight the 100 years of Inner Wheel's great existence, we had our Centennial Hi-Tea at the Majestic Hotel Kuala Lumpur on January 06, 2024. About 100 members from the 20 clubs in West Malaysia took part in this event. It was a beautiful evening of friendship and fellowship. The highlight of the event was the honoring of District 330's "Golden Ladies" who have been in Inner Wheel for 45 years and more. In total 13 Ladies were given a plaque each. To commemorate this auspicious day, Inner Wheel scarves with the Centennial logo were given to all participants. This was the 2nd fellowship that was held for the term, the 1st being the Fellowship Dinner on the eve of the District's Annual General Meeting. This too was a great success as most of the members, especially those who were staying away from the Klang valley took the opportunity to rekindle their friendship with those they don't get to meet often.

To foster goodwill and friendship, I made 2 trips to India, that is, to attend the Mahabalipuram Convention in Tamil Nadu in September 2023, and another was to attend a convention in Karnataka in late November 2023. Both conventions were an eye opener and the experiences gained will always be cherished. In addition to this, I also attended the Manchester Convention in May 2024 along with about 25 others from District 330, 331 and 332. It was a great opportunity to meet, greet, and mingle with about 2,300 Inner Wheel members from all over the world. Again, it was a knowledge-gaining experience as all the other conventions have been.

District 330, in its effort to increase membership and the number of clubs, chartered a new club, Inner Wheel Club of Parklands in the Klang Valley on November 04, 2023. It started with 64 members. The District Extension Chairman and her team did put much effort in ensuring the quick registration and chartering of the club. Along the way, the District did face minor issues in a few clubs but these were ironed out and today the District has 435 members spread out in 20 clubs. It is my fervent hope and prayer that the district will continue to grow, more clubs will be formed and its membership strength will increase. Although it was stated at the Manchester Convention that Inner Wheel in many countries were having issues in keeping their membership healthy and clubs from closing, it is important for us to take up the challenge to fortify the friendship that has been brewed by Inner Wheel. To maintain a healthy lifestyle, friendship is a key factor that lays the foundation. Friendship with service to not only oneself but to the community and society is fundamental to growth and well-being. When children grow and take flight and the family grows smaller, ones' friends are the ones who remain and spice up our lives.

My club visits were delightful and were full of new experiences. It gave me the privilege of meeting most of the members in the District. The clubs welcomed me and my Executives warmly. We had healthy discussions on club growth, welfare, and cohesiveness. The most common problem that was faced by many clubs was influencing members to take up posts at the club executive levels. One must understand that to enhance growth one will have to take the chance to learn. If steps are not taken to educate oneself then she will be left lagging behind. Encouragement must be given, Constructive criticisms can be appreciated but one will have to keep in mind that not all criticisms will be taken kindly. Those in the role of presidents will have to learn to give their executives the freedom and choice to make their decisions. It cannot be a matter of 'I say, you follow' or 'do as I tell you to do' or 'I am the President, I am the one who decided' All these will lead to failure of the club. The senior members in the club will have to be the facilitators, the advisors, and the counselors. They must remember that the younger members are of the new generation which is tech savvy and at the same time they will need a lot of input into matters that are new to them. So be patient and do not frighten them away. We need the strength and ability of these young people. Clubs will have to be more accommodative. The future of Inner Wheel depends on the new generation that we need to nurture and educate

It was my great fortune that I had an excellent team of District Executives. The cohesiveness amongst us was very strong and we could blend well with each other. They were open and we could discuss matters at length before drawing conclusions. All decisions were collectively taken and as such we understood each other well. Having this openness allowed us to withstand tiring situations which arose from time to time. Whatever difficulty that my officers or I met with was taken in stride with the good feeling that all were in the dilemma together. The educationist in me enabled me to draw the best out of each of them. I saw this as educational and training as I envision them as a District Chairman in time to come. For this reason, I invited my team of executives to accompany me on my club visits.

As my term comes to an end, I feel fulfilled in the responsibilities and duties that were entrusted to me. There were good times and equally bad times that could not be avoided. If all officers of the district or the club were to take pride in the job that has been entrusted upon them then the work becomes easy and delightful. If one was to shy away from her duty and responsibility then she will have to reconsider accepting the position. Progress will be hindered.

As I take leave, my sincere appreciation and heartfelt gratitude goes to my executive team. I am so very proud of all of you and wish all of you the very best for the journey ahead. Work well and enjoy every minute that you have. I wish incoming 44th District Chairman Vimalavathi T.P. Thayaman Pillai, all the very best for a successful term. Be the irresistible "Heartbeat of the Community" and work to "Reach and Inspire for a Better World".

#### Introduction

As the District Extension Chairman for the 2023-2024 term, my primary responsibilities included the growth and support of our district's clubs. This report summarizes my key achievements, particularly the chartering of a new club and mediation efforts in troubled clubs, reflecting the progress and challenges faced during my tenure.

#### Chartering a New Club

One of the significant accomplishments of my term was the successful chartering of a new club – IWC Parklands. This process involved several critical steps:

An extension committee was formed, comprising past district leaders, namely PNR Juanita Lee, PNR Parimala Satheesan and PDE Padmini Pillai. This committee worked closely with me to draft bylaws, set up initial meetings, and plan the club's first meeting as well as subsequent ones. District Chairman Kamala Yeap was extremely supportive of our efforts and always made it a point to attend all the interest meetings and club meetings.

After the initial interest meeting on 10th of July, an inaugural meeting was held on the 29th of July 2023. This meeting was well attended by many new members and it was decided that Dr Theyveeka Selvy Rajoo would be the charter president of the club and that the club would be called IWC Parklands. Normally the extension chairman would take all the relevant documents and send it to IIW in Manchester to get the charter. However, in this instance I decided to wait for the club registration from the Registrar of Societies (ROS) before proceeding to get the charter. Fortunately for this new club, ROS approval came in just 2 working days and I could proceed with the charter application. On the 9th of August 2023, IWC Parklands received its charter from IIW President Trish Douglas.

The culmination of these efforts was the official chartering ceremony, held on 4th November 2023. The event was well-attended, including district leaders like National Representative Datin Dr Ramani Subramaniam, District Chairman Kamala Yeap, PNR Parimala Satheesan, community members, and the newly inducted club members. Charter was handed over to Charter President Dr Theyveeka by NR Dr Ramani Subramaniam and DC Kamala Yeap witnessed by the district extension team. This marked a new chapter for the district, expanding our reach and influence. Newly minted Charter President Dr Theyveeka and her 60 club members were a joy to watch on their grand charter night celebration.

#### Mediating Issues in Troubled Clubs

Another crucial aspect of my role was addressing and mediating issues within troubled clubs. This was essential to ensure the stability and growth of the district.

Regular communication with club presidents and members helped identify clubs facing significant challenges. These challenges ranged from declining membership and leadership conflicts to financial difficulties and lack of engagement.

Upon identifying troubled clubs, assessments were conducted to understand the root causes of their issues. This involved meetings with club leadership, surveys among members, and reviewing club

In cases where conflicts were the primary issue, I facilitated mediation sessions. These sessions provided a neutral platform for leaders and members to voice their concerns and collaboratively develop solutions. My mediation often focused on improving communication, redefining roles, and setting clear goals.

For clubs struggling with membership and engagement, lorganized targeted training sessions. Additionally, I provided ongoing support and mentorship to club leaders to ensure the implementation of new strategies.

After initial interventions, regular follow-up was practiced with these clubs to monitor progress and provide additional support as needed. This ongoing support was crucial in helping clubs stabilize and begin to thrive again.

#### Conclusion

The 2023-2024 term as District Extension Chairman was marked by significant achievements and valuable learning experiences. Chartering a new club expanded our district's reach and brought new energy and enthusiasm. Meanwhile, mediating issues within troubled clubs helped to stabilize and strengthen our existing clubs, ensuring their continued success.

These accomplishments would not have been possible without the collaborative efforts of the dedicated members of my extension team, club presidents, and district members. My heartfelt appreciation goes out to NR Dr Ramani Subramaniam, DC Kamala Yeap, PNR Juanita Lee, PNR Parimala Satheesan, PDE Padmini Pillai and all the exco members of District 330 of 23-24. I am confident that the groundwork laid this term will contribute to the long-term growth and vitality of our district.
